4) **French cinema.** This is a good way to improve your cultural knowledge and linguistic skills. Watch films with subtitles in English first, and then in French. This way you listen and read so you can see the spelling, hear the pronunciation and learn the meaning in a context, all at the same time. If you have access to Netflix, there are quite a few good films. The series "dix pour cent" is worth watching.
