## **Examination and Assessment**

The coursework aspect of this qualification is worth 60% of the final grade (30% per coursework unit). The coursework is completed at the end of the study of this unit and consists of four coursework tasks. Both coursework sets have a practical element: preparing a child's meal for RO58 and planning and delivering a play activity for RO59.

The examination aspect of this qualification is worth 40% of the final grade and takes place in May or June and assesses the content of Unit RO57. This is taught first at the beginning of the qualification (so that it can be referred to in the coursework) and is then revised before sitting the exam. It lasts for 1 hour and 15 minutes and consists of a mixture of multiple-choice, short-answer and extended-response questions.
